Module 2 — Role fundamentals (40h recommended)

Theory: The knowledge the NOS require, taught to the standard's depth

Lab: Structured practicals per NOS

Output: Practical record per standard

Module 3 — Applied project (45h recommended)

Theory: A project chosen so that its deliverables evidence the NOS

Lab: Build with NOS evidence captured as you go

Output: Project plus evidence portfolio

Module 4 — Assessment preparation (15h recommended)

Theory: Assessment format, sample questions, practical rehearsal

Lab: Full mock assessment

Output: Mock assessment result and gap plan

Module 5 — Certification (10h recommended)

Theory: The nasscom assessment itself and its evidence requirements

Lab: Sit the assessment

Output: Assessment attempt record
